

SUPPLEMENTAL LEARNING ACTIVITY FOCUSING CHILDREN ON LEARNING GOALS

SET THE STAGE: FACILITATOR GUIDE

This is the first in a sequence of three learning activities that address strategies to help children focus on learning goals. Consider conducting this activity following Slide 5: Setting the Stage: Before the Activity. Another option is to conduct the three activities together following Slide 10.

Activity overview: Participants are asked to think about how to explain the learning goals of an activity to children before they begin the activity.

Directions: Prior to the training, select learning goals based on domains from the Head Start Child Development and Early Learning Framework (HSCDELF). Write the domain and each goal on a small slip of paper and place the slips into a container. Some domains and goals are provided on the following pages for use, if desired.

Divide the large group into smaller groups.

Ask a member of each group to pick three to five slips of paper from the container. Participants brainstorm and then write down how they would explain each learning goal to children. Ask them to circle their favorite example to share with the larger group.

Example:

HSCDELF domain	Learning goal	Description (Write down what you could say to children about each learning goal.)
1. Approaches to Learning	Sets goals and develops and follows through on plans	I see you decided to use watercolors. You have the water, paint, paper, and a small brush. I'm excited to see your painting when you finish!
2. Mathematics Knowledge & Skills	Recognizes and names common shapes	When I bring out the blocks today, I want you to really look at them so you can tell me about the shapes. You can tell me how many sides they have, how many corners they have, and how long the sides are.
3. Social Studies Knowlege & Skills	Recognizes a variety of jobs and the work associated with them	When we go on our walk today, let's look for all the people who work outside. When we come back in, we'll write down all the names of their jobs.

Note: Learning goals can be personalized to the specific needs of the audience.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT & HEALTH Eats a variety of nutritious foods	LOGIC & REASONING Recognizes cause and effect relationships
PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT & HEALTH Develops balance	LOGIC & REASONING Engages in pretend play and acts out roles
