Provide digital learning suites for children, with activities for children to complete with their parents. Share resource libraries and lists with parents to provide additional information. Strategy 4. Check in virtually to integrate online learning into real-life contexts.	 Support and supplement online learning. Connect as a group to discuss learning. Observe learned skills in practice. 	 Follow-up to parent meetings and workshops One-to-one parenting curriculum sessions Virtual support groups
Strategy 5. Create virtual spaces for families to connect and build community.	 Use social media, online forums, or blogs to share information. Conduct virtual group meetings. 	 Virtual Policy Council and parent committee meetings Virtual social support and parent group meetings Connections with community partners to help families gain access to the internet and other technology (e.g., free or discounted WiFi, hot spots, etc.) Private Facebook pages for families
