# Forging New Partnerships – Core Elements

- Build trust
- Understand each other's mandates
- Find mutually beneficial goals/ outcomes
- Establish an MOU

- Cross training
- Referral system
- Celebrate successes and process incidents
- Revisit relationship regularly
